

RESULTS



Analysis of the data revealed the comments of students on 17 attributes in the following way:

Attribute no.1: About the contents of the syllabus,

The 57% of students opined that the syllabus they studied is adequate.

Attribute no.2: About the contents of the syllabus,

69% of the students commented that have adequately benefited from the syllabus they studied.

Attribute no.3: Whether the course is easy or difficult

According to 85% of students the course is manageable

Attribute no.4: About the coverage of the syllabus

57% of the students commented that the teachers covered the syllabus about 85-100%. About 29% of students opened that the teachers covered the syllabus about 70-85%

Attribute no.5: Regarding the library

65% of the students commented that library is adequate and about 5% students mentioned that library facility is more than adequate.

Attribute no.6: About the library accessibility

According to 51% of the students, they got material from library with some difficulty,44% students stated that they got materials easily from library.

Attribute no.7: About the preparation of teachers for the class

53% of the students commented that the teacher satisfactorily prepare reported that teachers prepared for classes thoroughly.

Attribute no.8: About the communication of the teachers

According to 60% of the students the teachers always communicated effectively with them.

Attribute no.9: About the teachers' encouragement of students' for participation in the class

Most of the students commented that teachers' always encourages then for participation in the class.

Attribute no.10: Regarding the methods used by the teachers' for encouraging students

48% of the students commented that teachers get involved in the class for encouraging students and 35% stated that they encouraged raising question in the class.

Attribute no.11 . About the helpfulness of teacher's advice

According to 71% of the students the teachers advices were very helpful.



Attribute no.12. Regarding the teachers' approach

71% of the students commented that, teachers' approach was courteous whereas 20% mentioned that sometimes they were rude.

Attribute no.13: About the internal assessment of the course

The internal assessment of the course was fair according to 66% of students and 32% stated it as sometimes unfair.

Attribute no.14: About the effects of internal assessment on the grade of the course

According to 87% students internal assessment helps to improve course grade.

Attribute no.15: About the way of providing feedback to the students by the teacher

68% students commented that teachers provide feedback with helpful comments and 30% reported that teachers provide feedback in time.

Attribute no.16: Whether teacher discussed assignment with students

The teachers fully discussed assignment with then according to 61% of students.

Attribute no.17: Whether teacher providing course contributing lecture outline at the beginning

According to 97% of students the teacher provides course contributory lecture at the beginning of the class.



It has been observed that the analysis of student's feedback shows that maximum numbers of students are satisfied with the facility in the college campus, teacher's quality, examination system, library facility etc. But a few numbers of students displays their views on college resources and facilities. Therefore, the college authority should try to channelize the needs

of the students which they opined at the feedback collection.


METHODOLOGY



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
Students' view on accessibility of prescribe reading in library







SUMMARY OF THE STUDENTS' FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT



The Feedback Performa for students includes five dimensions namely Curriculum, Teachers and Information Resources of the college having with 17 attributes. A total number of 160 B A 6th Semester sample students' feedback has been analyzed during the session 2018-2019. Regarding syllabus, 76% students opined that it is adequate, 16% expressed their view as challenging and dull respectively. Majority (53%) of the students recorded their comments as adequate and more than adequate in connection with benefits from course curriculum. In addition,41% students viewed that conception of the course is manageable, 31% of students responded as difficult and rest 28% as easy. Moreover, 78% students commented that the teacher covers 85%--100% courses, 13% students expressed that the teacher covers 70%--85%. In addition, 53% and 47% students responded that the material and library facilities of the college are adequate and excellent respectively. Majority of the students i.e. 59% easily and 41% with some difficulty can access the prescribe reading of library. However, 53%, 41%, 6% students commented that the teacher prepare for class thoroughly, satisfactorily and poorly respectively. In addition, the teachers communicated with students always effectively, sometimes effectively and satisfactorily as per 53%, 41% and 6% student's responses respectively. Moreover, regarding teachers' encouragement in class, 51%, 43% and 6% responded as always, sometimes and rarely respectively. Majority of the students i.e. 44% commented that the teacher encourage the students in class and 34% students opined that the teacher encourage in class through raising questions in class and 16% encourages the students through discussion individually with them. However, 60% students commented that teachers' advice is very helpful, 34% students opined that it is sometimes helpful and 6% students commented as not at all helpful. With regard to teachers' approach apparent that 56%, 35% and 9% students commented as courteous, sometimes rude and can't say respectively. So far internal assessment is concerned it is apparent that 69% students are viewed as always fair and 14% students are expressed their comments as regularly fair. Only 5% students are recorded their responses as sometimes unfair and rest 12% students cannot say in this regard. Regarding

is sometimes effective and remaining 8% cannot say in this connection. Moreover, 49% students commented that the teacher provide regular feedback on their performance and 41% students expressed the teacher provide feedback to them with helpful comments and rest opined that the teacher provide feedback on their performance often late. Majority of the students i.e. 51% opined that the teacher fully discusses on assignments with students and 38% commented that the teacher partially discusses with on their assignments. Only 11% students said that the teacher sometimes discusses on assignments with them. Thus, the students' feedbacks regarding all dimensions having 17 attributes are found in positive and satisfactory direction.





1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?


Around 83.87% respondents agree that the 85-100% of the Syllabus is completed in due time. This reveals the systematic approach to syllabus division.











14. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.


There cannot be a holistic development without extracurricular activities. 79.56% respondents strongly agree that teachers would encourage them to participate. None strongly disagree with the same.










Count of Parameter-1: The Current Curriculum is relevant for employability.










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


Count of Criteria-5: Faculty and quality of teaching




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9. Facilities of Canteen


Introduction

Count of Criteria-1: Transparency in admission procedure



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


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


Count of Criteria-5: Faculty and quality of teaching



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


Count of Criteria-8: Co-Curricular activities




