Sensitization Programme on 'Gender Discrimination in Society'

The women forum, Khagarijan College organised a gender sensitization program on the theme "Gender Discrimination in society" on 10th March,2021 in the college campus. Dr Sukanya Bora, Assistant professor, department of Psychology, Nonoi College, Nagaon was the resource person of the program. Dr. Ramesh Nath, principal of the college delivered the inaugural speech and Mrs Umme Salma convenor of the forum explained the relevance of the theme.



The resource person explained vividly about the causes and issues of gender discrimination.



She stated that gender discrimination still exists in our India and more in our state Assam. She mentioned that at her workplace women have limited access to job opportunities and are paid less for the same work. Poverty, social customs, beliefs and practices, lack of awareness among women etc are the causes of this problem. The resource person explained the issues related to gender discrimination like unequal pay, sexual harassment, women are promoted less than men, struggle with asking

for higher pay etc. The program was anchored by Miss Rupali Talukdar, member of women forum and also offered the vote of thanks. About 15 teachers and 50 students were present in the program.

Seminar on Sensitizing Gender: Preventing and Combating Violence Against Women

An Institutional Seminar on "Sensitizing Gender: Preventing & Combating Violence Against Women" was conducted on 29th of December 2021, as a part of the initiative taken by the Women Forum, Khagarijan College, Nagaon, Assam within the college premises. The resource person Advocate Jesmin Begum from the Nagaon Bar Association delivered an interesting talk regarding violence against women and the legal frameworks that are present to safeguard the interest of the women section of the society. She emphasized on the laws and regulations as well as rights and provisions that are present to combat violence against

women but are often overlooked due to lack of awareness. Furthermore, she encouraged all the students to know these provisions and become the mouthpiece to deliver this knowledge to areas and to women who are unaware of these safeguards.



This awareness centric seminar was inaugurated by Dr Ramesh Nath, Principal, Khagarijan College and was anchored by Ms Rupali Talukdar, Assistant Professor, Dept of Economics, Khagarijan College. Refreshments were then distributed amongst the students and faculty members. 15 faculty members and more than 60 students attended the seminar.
