INTRODUCTION

The feedback tabulation framework is a system of basic check and assessment of the overall performance quality of an educational institution. As an integral part of education and training programs, this framework aids to the growth of an institution by highlighting the scopes of improvement of the educational facilities as well as in the teaching learning process. With this goal in mind, feedback assessment analysis has been carried out for the session 2019-20 to be able to gain an input on the further probable improvements in curriculum and a better growth of the institution's academic ambience.

METHODOLOGY

The Feedback Analysis Committee took the initiative of having the feedback forms being sent to the parents through the students. Questionnaires with suitable options were distributed among the parents of the B.A. 6th semester students having Major and General of the session 2019-20. The questionnaires included various parameters including references to co-curricular activities and curriculum that their children were engaged in. The Parents' feedback forms were distributed among students for collecting the feedback from their parents. Among the parents', 67 have returned the filled-up forms. The responses were then tabulated for analysis.

ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK FROM PARENTS

The completed feedback forms were collected from the parents whose children were enrolled in B.A. 6th semester. The responses have been tabulated for proper and a focused analysis.

1. Holistic Development of Students through Co- Curricular Activities:





